# Spring 1 Curriculum

The information below will give you an overview of what areas we will be covering across the curriculum this term.

Maths – This half term key focuses will measure, ratio and algebra. We will continue to have daily arithmetic bursts and time to recap key skills. Last term, we covered place value, the four operations, decimals, fractions and percentages so these we be areas we will continue to revisit. Any extra times tables work at home would also be hugely beneficial to help to improve children's speed and accuracy.

English – Our core text this term is Darwin's Dragon's by Lindsay Galvin; this text blends historical fiction with an element of fantasy. This will be used to cover key reading objectives and to inspire a range of creative writing. We will also be linking some non-fiction writing to our geography theme: the Galapagos Islands.

Geography – In geography, we will be exploring the Galapagos Islands. As well as developing locational knowledge and mapping skills, we will be learning about how the islands have changed over time as well as discussing current threats from human activity and sustainable solutions.

**Science** – Our science theme this half term is 'evolution and inheritance'. We will begin by exploring fossils and their formation before learning about variation in offspring and how animals have evolved and adapted to suit their environment. We will be exploring the work of Charles Darwin and Mary Anning.

Art - We will be using Modroc to make a sculpture of a Galapagos tortoise.

**RE** – We will be learning about Muslim families and important traditions in Islam. This builds on and develops previous learning from our year 4 study of Islam.

**Computing** – In computing, we will be covering online safety and databases.

**PSHE** – Our theme is healthy lifestyles and wellbeing.

French - This will include revising and developing talking about hoppies and food.

Music - Mrs Chadbourne will continue to teach music with a focus on composition and performance.
