Spring 2 Curriculum



The information below will give you an overview of what areas we will be covering across the curriculum this term.

Maths – This half term, we will be covering area, perimeter and volume, statistics, shape and position and direction. We will continue to have a daily (short) arithmetic session and to recap prior learning. Any extra times tables to help with recall and fluency would be very beneficial.

English – Our core text half term will be Michael Morpurgo's retelling of Beowulf. This will be our focus for reading and writing. We will also be producing some non-fiction work around the Anglo-Saxon ship burial at Sutton Hoo.

History—In history this half term, we will exploring the Anglo-Saxons. Initially, we will use different sources to discover what Britain was like after the Roman period and then learn about key features of Anglo-Saxon society, such as religious beliefs and the formation of the Anglo-Saxon Kingdoms.

Science – Our science theme this half term is animals, including humans and we will be exploring the human Circulatory system, recognising the impact of a healthy lifestyle and describing ways in which nutrients and water are transported within the human body.

Art – We will be exploring Anglo-Saxon patterns and using Careful observation to inspire our own creations including illuminating our initials.

RE – This half-term, our theme will be 'Salvation' and we will be exploring the question 'What difference does the resurrection make to Christians?'

Computing – In Computing, we will be covering units on blogging and text adventures.

Music - Mrs Chadbourne will continue to teach music with a focus on composition and performance.
