
A Typical Week in Class R

In Class R we aim to encourage your child to become an independent learner. The room is arranged to help them make decisions, co-operate with others and take responsibility for their actions. It is divided into specific working areas, thus encouraging children to work closely together whilst enabling them to develop their social skills. Some activities are available everyday e.g. sand, water, mark making, painting etc. Children are able to revisit these areas and consolidate their learning. Other tasks are set for children to encounter more specific areas of the curriculum.

The children in Class R follow the new 'Early Years Foundation Stage Framework', which was statutory from September 2021. This is divided into three prime areas and four specific areas of learning. The prime areas cover the knowledge and skills which are the foundations for children's school readiness and future progress. These Communication and Language, Physical Development and Personal, Social and Emotional Development. The specific areas of learning are Literacy, Mathematics, Understanding the World and Expressive Arts and Design. These areas are delivered through an integrated approach with the intention of maximising the value of a cross-curricular approach.




School Milk

This is now organised by the firm 'Cool Milk at School Ltd'. It is available every day for any parents who wish their child to have it. Your child **must be registered** to ensure they receive their milk. The easiest way to do

this is to register online at www.coolmilk.com (also available at the free school meals address, as below).

order placed at the dairy after you have registered them. Free milk will stop the Friday prior to your child's fifth birthday. You will be sent a payment request (from the company) prior to this date should you wish to continue with the milk. If your child is not eligible for free milk (they are over 5), a payment request, along with details of how to pay, will be made to the correspondence address you included in your registration.





The school **does not** register any children for milk, it is your responsibility to do so.

School Lunches

As of September 2014, children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to free school meals.

Whilst all pupils in these year groups will be provided with a free school meal, it is important that those families who are eligible to receive a free school meal continue to apply to the local authority to ensure that the pupil premium (additional money the school receives) is allocated appropriately. The pupil premium is additional funding given to schools.



For any child to receive a school dinner, they must have registered for a 'sQuid' account. This is an online payment system for school meals. Although you will **not be charged for any meals**, this is the system used for registering your child for their free meal and is also used each day as a receipting system when your child has had their meal. We will provide you with more information about this at the meeting on **8 June 2023**. If you would prefer your child not to have their free school dinner, then you may send them in with a packed lunch. However, if at any point you decided you would like them to have a dinner, for them to receive one they must be registered with a 'sQuid' account. Also, all school trips are now paid for through this system.



Communication Updates

We would like to take this opportunity to invite you to join our school communications app – Yammer. This is a Microsoft based app that is used to communicate messages between school and home. We would like to invite you to initially join our **Class Reception 2023/24** page, with invitations to the whole school parent page from September. On the

Class R page, you are likely to see:

- Photos of the children engaged in our continuous provision
- Star of the week
- Letters and flyers regarding extracurricular activities
- Information about the upcoming term – e.g., curriculum overview



Medicines During School Hours

Medicines should only be brought to school when essential; that is where it would be detrimental to a child's health if the medicine was not administered during the school or setting 'day'. It can be helpful, where clinically appropriate, if medicines are prescribed in dose frequencies which enable it to be taken outside school hours. Parents could be encouraged to ask the prescriber about this. Should you have any further questions regarding this please contact the admin team.

Holidays


The law states that you do not have the right to take your child out of school/for holidays during term time. The Local Authority works with schools to reduce the number of children missing school because of holidays taken in term time and schools can refuse your request. To take your child on holiday during term time, you must apply for permission in advance in writing using a form available from the school office. Permission for authorised leave of absence may be granted for holidays in exceptional circumstances.

Supporting Your Child at Home

During the time your child spends with you at home, you can help support their learning by encouraging them to take part in a wide range of activities such as:

- this encourages children to become familiar with books and help to nurture an interest and enjoyment of them. This is important when they begin to learn to read.
- Singing nursery rhymes and other children's songs – this helps with a sense of rhythm and importantly, rhyme. It also uses the memory, which developmentally is important for reading.
- Jigsaws This helps to make your child aware of patterns, similarities, differences and encourages problem solving. These are all skills which are integral to number and language work.
- Playing games This shows children how to take turns and understand that not everyone can win.







Preparing for School

 If you haven't already, please sign up to our Yammer page so you can be part of our online school community and receive all

relevant information.

 Please buy an embroidered book bag rather than a backpack, to transport your child's reading books, reading diaries, homework, and letters etc. to and from school.

 Ensure all your child's belonging have been labelled, this is particularly important for items of uniform they are likely to take off

 e.g., coats, jumpers, cardigans, shoes.


This includes items of PE kit likely to be taken off in the event the children are warm etc.

- Please send your child into school daily with a **water bottle** (again labelled) so they have access to water throughout the day.
- Encourage your child to do the following independently:
 - Dress and undress themselves, including buttons
 - Fasten their shoes and coats, including zips and buttons
 - Go to the toilet unaided
 - Wash and dry their hands
 - Use a knife and fork
