Curriculum Intent

At Woodborough Woods, we provide every child the opportunity to learn a language, this encourages inquisitiveness and confidence in learning a language and about other cultures and people. Through songs, games and interactive learning, children begin to develop a love of languages. We celebrate diversity and strive to learn more about how other people around the world think and act.

Knowledge and Understanding

French speakers develop an understanding of greetings, statements, questions, set of instructions and can understand how the French language is structured and organised. Our children grow an understanding of French life.

Grammar

Children study areas of Grammar including nouns and their gender, whether they are singular & plural, and definite & indefinite articles. Adjectives, including possessive adjectives; masculine, feminine & plural agreements. Verbs as well as negative & imperative. Questions, noting inversion of verb & subject. Prepositions - a range used in the French language.

National French Day

On Bastille Day on the 14th July, the children will learn about the history of France, taste test French food and practise their oracy skills. They will research famous French artists and musicians.
