Snacks and Water



Curriculum Overview

Our topic this term is Autumn and Celebrations.

Area of Learning	Learning Intentions			
Communication and Language	Verbal communication of ideas, sequencing events, phase 2 and 3 phonics.			
Personal, Social and Emotional Development	This term children will learn how we all have different beliefs and celebrations, what characteristics make a good friend, and how we need to listen to one another.			
Physical Development	Gross and fine motor skills, awareness of school environments, travelling and balancing on different parts of the body, catching and throwing.			
Literacy	Repetition, recall of story and characters, writing their names with confidence. Beginning to mark make cvc's with some accuracy.			
Mathematics	Counting on to 10 and back and 20 and back, recognising numbers to 10 and subitising numbers to 10, ordering to 10, counting 1 number to 1 object, find one more or one less up to 10, selecting the correct number to represent objects, comparative language (size, weight), 2D shapes, creating and describing patterns, days of the week, positional language			
Understanding the World	Talk about their surroundings, listening to sounds and their source, healthy food, signs of Autumn, celebrations and how they vary around the world.			
Expressive Arts and Design	Collage, painting, high and low sounds, singing a wide range of songs, dance, sound effects to stories, printing.			
RE	Special times in different religions. Exploring why Christians tell the Nativity Story.
