Each child records their daily reads in a reading diary. When they reach 100		
they receive a certificate and have their names read out in the shining star		
assembly. At 200 reads they are able to choose a book and if they reach 300		
reads they are invited to a party. We also celebrate World Book Day and		
buddy up with other classes for a shared read. Volunteers regularly read with		
the children. Children across the school often read alongside each other.
